

TO MARK THE 10th ANNIVERSARY OF THE CAMPAIGN TO END FISTULA AND THE FIRST INTERNATIONAL DAY TO END OBSTETRIC FISTULA ON 23 MAY, THE GLOBAL ALLIANCE AGAINST FEMALE GENITAL MUTILATION (GA-FGM) AND THE GENEVA FOUNDATION FOR MEDICAL EDUCATION AND RE-SEARCH (GFMER) COMBINE THEIR EFFORTS TO RAISE AWARENESS FOR THAT CAUSE AND INVITE TO A DEBATE AT THE CLUB SUISSE DE LA PRESSE.

Geneva, 23 May 2013

In the developing world it is estimated that 2 to 3 million women are suffering from obstetric fistula. Obstetric fistula is a consequence of a difficult child delivery, conducted without medical assistance where the child ends up dying due to a lack of on-time access to a caesarian. The devastating and subsequent damages lead, for women who manage to survive, to a total urinary incontinence. These women, often very young, are inevitably rejected, stigmatized and have to confront alone their pain and suffering.

50,000 new cases will develop each year. Virtually eliminated in industrialized nations, the persistence of obstetric fistula is a sign of failure from public health systems in addressing obstetrical emergencies and a human rights tragedy. This disease can also be one of the devastating consequences of the practice of Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) or rape as a weapon of war.

Dr Charles-Henry Rochat, head of the « fistula » program of the Geneva Foundation for Medical Education and Research (GFMER) will present the global model of medical care he has developed during his field work over the past 15 years. In a joint-effort to raise awareness about this cause, the **Global Alliance against Female Genital Mutilation (GA-FGM)** in collaboration with the **Geneva Foundation for Medical Education and Research (GFMER)** are happy to invite you to a debate at le Club suisse de la presse.

On this occasion, Mr Holger Postulart, of the Global Alliance against FGM (GA-FGM) will give information for the creation of the **first University Chair specializing on FGM**, an initiative supported by GIZ, the German Agency for International Cooperation. A premiere !
