

GLOBAL MAPPING OF DESIRE

The *Pleasure Project* gives a new *epistemological* paradigm for sexual epidemiology: **orientation, behaviour, identity** and **pleasure**





GLOBAL MAPPING OF DESIRE II

- o to 12: Desired ... number of children
- 15 45 (49) then: Menopause
- **16%:** Orgasmic ability
- **61%**: Sexual pain
- Infinity: Norms, ideas, values on love or sexuality

GLOBAL MAPPING OF DESIRE III

- Sex surveys based on random samples
- Surveys of specific groups (disabled, adolescent, older, chronically sick, commercial sex workers, female cancer patients, incarcerated)
- Hypoactive sexual desire disorder ...
- Norms, ideas, values on love or sexuality

developmental tasks

Love is not great delight but desire to please God in everything.

Raptures overcame her overwhelmed senses with glorious foolishness, prayer of union where she felt the sun melt her away.

If she felt her body was going to levitate she stretched out on the floor and called the nuns to sit on her and hold her down. Far from being excited about these events, she "begged very much not to give me any more favors in public."

attempted definition

Sexuality is a central aspect of being human throughout life and encompasses sex, gender identities and roles, sexual orientation, eroticism, pleasure, intimacy and reproduction. Sexuality is experienced and expressed in thoughts, fantasies, desires, beliefs, attitudes, values, behaviours, practices, roles and relationships. While sexuality can include all of these dimensions, not all of them are always experienced or expressed. Sexuality is influenced by the interaction of biological, psychological, social, economic, political, cultural, ethical, legal, historical, religious and spiritual factors. (WHO 2002)

historical-cultural representation

- Perceptions and constructions of sex, gender, love, body image, affection, friendship, erotic love, divine love
- Greco-Roman, Judeo-Christian, Buddhist-Hindu, Arab-Islamic, African, Animist

religion

Records of human sexual and erotic experience in faith-based values:

- Allegory for divinehuman interaction,
- Good gift
- Curse
- Duty
- Cult of (female) virginity
- Ideals of chastity

menopause

- Regularly preoccupation in religious texts (even though the texts are usually written by men)
- Important transition for women in terms of their experience of sex
- Reduced estrogen / lowered sexual desire?
- Loss of sexual response or desire is not experienced by majority of menopausal women.
- Factors include individual attitudes towards sexuality, overall health and marital status
- Estrogen **not** related to postmenopausal changes in sexual response
- 17.2 % increase in breast cancer risk in use of both estrogen and testosterone during menopause for each year of use.




sexual constructs

- Power and sexuality models
 (Victorian/Freudian) sense and sensibility
 models (exoticism, esotericism)


objects of desire

- In-(acceptability)
- Consequent selfharm or social control
- Stigma index

- human trafficking


disabled desire

- In spinal cord injury hypersensitivity reported above injury when stimulated -> sexual arousal and sometimes orgasm.
- Misconceptions: single person will never find a partner, existing life partner will leave due to injury complications.
- Inability to move does not imply inability to please or to be pleased.
 Absence of sensation does not mean there an absence of feeling.



hypoactive sexual desire disorder

- Prevalence of low sexual desire
- Representative sample of ...American women

- Specificity of sexuality in adolescence
- Disability

commerce of sex

- prostitution
- commercial sex work
- sex for favours
- pornography
- use of sexual imagery in advertising

health models

- view of health, attitudes to illness, death and dying associated with sex (thanatos and eros)
- gender and sex roles

health interventions

- sexually transmitted infections
- HIV/AIDS and anti-retrovirals
- sexual therapy
- marriage guidance -> relationship
- contraceptive counselling
- assisted reproductive technology
- HPV vaccine
- Gender reassignement

comprehensive sexuality education

- sex education
- moral or religious obligation.
- social, community, parental or family duty
- health sector role in content and delivery
