Introduction

The Geneva Foundation for Medical Education and Research (GFMER) in collaboration with the World Health Organisation's (WHO) Department of Reproductive Health and Research and its Regional Office for Eastern Mediterranean (EMRO) announces the online training course in adolescent sexual and reproductive health for 2021.

This course provides health professionals with knowledge, skills and competencies in adolescent sexual and reproductive health, especially for those health care providers whose access to learning is limited by time, financial resources or other constraints and for whom access to quality education in the field of sexual and reproductive health is limited. With this training program, participants will learn first-hand about the day-to-day and long-term challenges in the field of adolescent sexual and reproductive health, with a particular focus on the Eastern Mediterranean Region.

What distinguishes this course from others is that the participants can build direct contact with WHO's Department of Reproductive Health and Research, EMRO and their respective GFMER country coordinators where applicable. This can strengthen professional networks for the participants and open new opportunities in their careers if they are motivated and have innovative ideas and ambitions.

Course Duration

25 January - 21 March 2021 (8 weeks)

Course Objectives

To build knowledge and understanding in the following areas:

- The rationale for the provision of a package of effective health and social interventions to promote adolescent sexual and reproductive health, to prevent health and social problems, and to respond to them if and when they arise.
- WHO's recommendations for the delivery of these interventions.
- Special considerations in delivering these interventions to adolescents including in humanitarian settings and COVID 19 pandemic.

Course Topics

- Comprehensive sexuality education provision
- Contraception counselling and provision
- Antenatal, intrapartum and postnatal care
- Safe abortion care
- Sexually transmitted infections prevention and care
- HIV prevention and care
- Violence against women and girls: prevention, support and care
- Harmful traditional practices (child marriage and female genital mutilation) prevention and response
- Approaches to ensuring the continuity of SRH information and service provision to adolescents in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic (this topic will be integrated into each module)



Learning Methods

Our online and interactive course is developed using a combination of the following teaching tools and technologies:

- Online presentations and videos.
- Assignment of a personal coach to each participant.
- Individual mentoring and follow-up: feedback and consultation with the coaches via email and/or audio/video chat.
- Online interaction with peers and coaches: forums, news groups and audio/video chat.
- Evaluations by the coaches and course coordinator: assignments are submitted electronically, and the coaches provide feedback.

At the beginning of the course, a personal coach will be assigned to each participant. When the course starts, course files will be published in the course website on weekly basis, as well as to inform each participant via email. More information about the course materials and assignments will be communicated through emails.

During the orientation phase of the course, participants will be informed about the requirements of assignments. Teachers will determine the appropriate time frame for the participants to complete their work. Participants will be instructed on how to submit their work for evaluation and when and how they will receive feedback.

Evaluation

The performance of the participants will be supervised by the personal coaches and the course coordinators. Throughout the course, participants will receive assignments. They will also receive advice from the course and country coordinators (where applicable), personal coaches and the GFMER team.

In other to obtain the course certificate, participants will have to complete all required assignments under the guidance of their coaches.

Certification

After completing the required course attendance and validating the course fee payment, the participant will obtain a certificate signed by the World Health Organization's Department of Sexual and Reproductive Health & Research, WHO Regional Office for Eastern Mediterranean and the Geneva Foundation for Medical Education and Research.

Awards

- The top ten participants will receive an additional certificate of commendation.
- The top five participants will get a set of books for personal and professional development.
