

"My name is Namakau Nyambe, I am Zambian and reside in Zambia. I work for the university of North Carolina at chapel hill as a project manager. Managing research projects around treatment and diagnosis of cervical pre-cancer.

I am happy to say that I am a proud product of the GFMER Sexual and Reproductive Health Research Methodology intake of 2015. I have been a coach since 2016/17 and I have assisted with coaching participants from Zambia and other counties in the Sub -Saharan region.

The importance of this course as well as other courses provider by GFMER cannot be over emphasized. Most developing countries cannot afford to provide or sponsor training for continuous education for health workers/ providers. Continuous Education is important for public health workers/ or health care providers. As this is a way in which new knowledge in terms of new trends in the health sector is gained. The importance of training health workers in research methodology cannot be over emphasized too. Health research is very cardinal for global health. Developing countries face many challenges which make it difficult for health research. One of the eminent barriers to research is lack of training in research among health workers....
